



## Pickerel Frog (*Lithobates palustris*)

### Visual

2 rows of square-ish blotches that touch the DL fold.

Prominent, long dorsolateral fold



Colour: never green  
Size: 4.5-8.5cm

### Context

- Habitat: need cool, stable water temperatures. More common around seepages in ponds and streams
- Time of Year: mid to late spring

### Audio

- Song: low nasal snore that increases in volume
- Sounds-like: cow mooing

**mooooOOO!**

## Mink Frog (*Lithobates septentrionalis*)

Mottled pattern on legs and back

Visual tympanum varies between individuals



Colour: olive to brown  
Size: 6-11 cm

### Context

- Habitat: large, cold permanent waterbodies and bogs. Rarely on land.
- Time of Day: night
- Time of Year: late spring to midsummer

### Audio

- Song: rapid, non-musical "Cut-cut-cut"
- Sounds-like: tapping metal hammer on wood

## Gray Treefrog (*Hyla versicolor*)

### Visual

Bumpy skin

Dark line



Colour: green, gray, brown  
Size: 3-6 cm

### Context

- Habitat: shallow woodland ponds, marshes, puddles with no current
- Time of Year: late spring to early summer

### Audio

- Song: slow, short-flute like trill
- Sounds-like: red-bellied woodpecker

**Brrrrrrrrr!**

## American Bullfrog (*Lithobates catesbeianus*)

### Visual

Fold wraps around tympani rather than down back



Colour: pale green to dark green-brown  
Size: 9.5-20 cm

### Context

- Habitat: large, permanent waterbodies
- Time of Day: humid, rainy nights
- Time of Year: late spring to mid summer

### Audio

- Song: deep and guttural "rum"

**jug-o-rum**

**ruuumruuum**

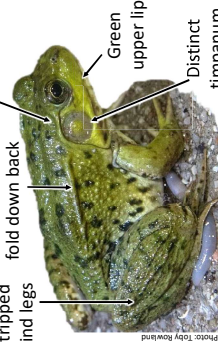
## Green Frog (*Lithobates clamitans melanota*)

### Visual

Stripped hind legs

Narrow dorsolateral fold down back

Fold around tympanum



Colour: green, brown, bronze  
Size: 6-11 cm

### Context

- Habitat: permanent waterbodies
- Time of Year: late spring to midsummer

### Audio

- Song: single "gunk!" sometime followed by multiple softer "gunks"
- Sounds-like: loose banjo sting
- Song 2: stuttering "rung" similar to bullfrog but not as deep

**GUNK! gunk gunk gunk**

**ru-u-u-ung**
