

- Time of Year: Spring


Audio

- Time of Year: mid to late spring



- Sounds-like: wet hands rubbing a balloon



- Time of Year: mid to late spring




- Habitat: shallow woodland ponds, marshes, puddles with no current

- Habitat: permanent waterbodies
- Time of Year: late spring to midsummer


Audio

- **Song:** single "gunk!" sometime followed by multiple softer "gunks"
- Sounds-like: loose banjo sting
- Song 2: stuttering "rung" similar to bullfrog but not as deep

Mink Frog (Lithobates septentrionalis)



Colour: olive to brown

Size: 6-11 cm

Context

- Habitat: large, cold permanent waterbodies and bogs
- Time of Day: night
- Time of Year: late spring to midsummer.

Song: rapid, non-musical
 Sounds-like: tapping metal hammer on wood

- Habitat: large, permanent waterbodies
- Time of Day: humid, rainy nights
- Time of Year: late spring to mid summer.
