

A BioBlitz is a one-day nature scavenger hunt where scientists, naturalists, and community members team up to find and record as many species as possible.

This year, one day will be at Kris Starr Sanctuary in the Carden area, and another at Blackwell Brady Clark Nature Reserve, the Couchiching Conservancy's newest reserve near Washago. Guides, Phil Careless, Matt Ireland, and Conservancy Stewardship staff biologist Toby Rowland will help participants learn about herptiles, invasives, and more. Others are welcome to explore on their own.

## Kris Starr Sanctuary – protected 14 years

Explore 107 acres where forests, wetlands, and the Land Between meet. Protected since 2012, visitors can enjoy views of the Head River, steep limestone slopes, and a peek at the Carden Alvar. Keep an eye out for moose, black bears, and singing Mourning Warblers along the 1.3 km trail.




# Discover Nature with iNaturalist

The Couchiching Conservancy protects over 15,000 acres of natural spaces. By recording the plants, animals, and fungi you see, you can help us understand and protect these special places.



- ✓ Discover what species live on our reserves
- ✓ Identify important habitat for plants and wildlife
- ✓ Map biodiversity across protected landscapes
- ✓ Guide future conservation decisions



## What is iNaturalist?

iNaturalist is a free app where anyone can photograph plants, animals, and fungi and share their observations with a global community. Other users, including experts and fellow nature enthusiasts, help identify the species.

# Connecting Landscapes

Nature works best when landscapes are connected. Ecological corridors link forests, wetlands, and waterways, allowing species to move between habitats and supporting healthy ecosystems.

When landscapes become divided by roads and development, it is harder for species to travel, find food, and maintain healthy populations. Corridors help restore these connections, allowing wildlife to move safely across the landscape and helping ecosystems stay resilient and healthy.



## Wild Routes

In September 2024, Conservancy biologist Toby Rowland set out on a three-day journey by foot and kayak to experience the landscape the way animals might.

Traveling from Little Lake in Barrie to Copeland Forest, the trek revealed the many challenges species face navigating a human-dominated landscape.

The journey highlighted the importance of connected habitats, safe crossings, and thoughtful land stewardship to help keep the landscape connected.

# Bat chat

Bats communicate in sounds too high-pitched for humans to hear. Volunteers use ultrasonic microphones to record their calls at stations across 20 of our properties. These recordings help track which species are active and where bats are thriving.

Bats play a big role in keeping nature balanced. Each night they eat thousands of insects, helping maintain a healthy ecosystem.

Flowing east of Orillia, the Black River is one of the region's most scenic and storied paddling routes. With gentle currents, winding channels, and rugged rock outcrops, it's perfect for a half or full day on the water.

The river winds through 730 acres of protected land cared for by The Couchiching Conservancy, including the Ron Reid Nature Reserve. These lands are home to wetlands, hardwood forests, and habitat for rare and declining species.

# Ron Reid Nature Reserve – protected 9 years

This property protects over 4 km of the Black River and was secured thanks to the support of hundreds of donors, including a major contribution from the Government of Canada's Natural Areas Conservation Program.

Surrounded by Queen Elizabeth II Wildlands Provincial Park, visitors can explore a 2 km trail to Ragged Rapids or enjoy canoeing along the river.

The land is named in honour of Ron Reid, a founder and the first Executive Director of The Couchiching Conservancy, who left a lasting legacy in land conservation.





# Visitor Etiquette

Our nature reserves represent years of conservation work and ongoing care by staff and volunteers. Please help us protect these special places by following a few simple guidelines:

**1 Tread Lightly** Enjoy low-impact activities like walking and birding. These spaces are for nature appreciation and quiet recreation.

**2 Dog on Leash** Keep pets on leash at all times to protect wildlife, sensitive habitats, and other visitors.

**3 Leave No Trace** Do not remove plants, mushrooms, sticks, or natural items. Pack out all litter and pet waste.

**4 Know Your Route** Download a map before you go. Stay on designated trails and let someone know your plans.

**5 Be Aware** Watch for changing weather, wildlife, and uneven terrain. Share the space respectfully.



**For your grandchildren. For wildlife. For quiet places to walk and breath.**


